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Course Description

Transfer matrix theory of systems, emphasis on feedback, internal stability, model matching and the assignment of invariant factors.

Course Pre-Requisites / Co-Requisites

EEL 5182, MAS 4105

Course Objectives

- **Specific Outcomes of Instruction:** A course on the transfer matrix theory of linear multivariable systems. The course will cover the theory of linear feedback control systems, using transfer matrices as the basic description of a system. The main control theoretic topics will be stabilization and pole assignment for multivariable systems.
- **Brief List of Topics to Be Covered**
 - The algebraic theory of transfer matrices; Canonical forms (5 weeks).
 - Integer invariants (Controllability and Observability indices) (2 weeks).
 - Internal stability of composite systems (1 week).
 - Model matching and stabilization of linear systems (2 weeks).
 - State feedback and the Rosenbrock Theorem (2 weeks).
 - Input/output assignment of invariant factors (2 weeks).
